



Château Bouscaut

GRAND CRU CLASSE DE GRAVE

Pessac Leognan Grand Cru Classe AOC, France

The Bouscaut vineyards exist since the 17th century on the commune of Cadaujac, within the Grave appellation. Called Haut Truchon, it was renamed Chateau Bouscaut in 1929 after the locally given name. The various owners throughout the twentieth century were very dedicated to improving and transforming both the vineyard and the château.



COUNTRY

France

VARIETAL

55% Sauvignon Blanc
45% Semillion

SOIL TYPE

Clay and calcaceous soils

VINEYARD

31 hectares of vineyards, predominantly planted with Merlot
35 years old vines

HARVEST

2011 white grapes were in an impeccable state of health during the harvest. The Sauvignon Blancs, just like the Semillons were close to 13° with a PH of around 3.30.

VINIFICATION

Malolactic fermentation takes place in vat and barrels. The wine is aged in an average of 45% new, French oak barrels for 16 months.

TASTING NOTES

On tasting, the two grape varieties complement one another remarkably well: the Semillons are beautiful and deep while the Sauvignon blanc show a lot of character. Mostly new barrels for the Semillon.

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
