



AOC Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Boudriotte

René Lamy's winery is located in the heart of the village of Chassagne-Montrachet and his family have been winegrowers here since the middle of the 17th Century. They own 15 hectares of vineyards, mostly in the appellations of Saint Aubin & Chassagne Montrachet, producing both white and red wines. They are also part of the 15 only privileged proprietors of the most prestigious Côtes de Beaune Grand Cru: Le Montrachet, with 0.0542 hectare making around 300 bottles each year.

# **TASTING NOTES**

The color of this Premier Cru is characterized by a ruby red. On the nose, aromas of cherries, blackberries and coffee with hints of earthiness and spices go together elegantly. The mouth, sublimate by elegant tannins, reminds notes of darker rasberries. Like Morgeot, La Boudriotte can have weight, depth, and richness, but is typically a bit more finessed.
